


First Responder First-aid Kit


PVHC Board of Director's relocate to Costa Rica





Moonlight Hike Schedule Change

The Energy Policy Act of 2005 amended the Uniform Time Act of 1966 by changing the start and end dates of daylight saving time. Clocks were set ahead one hour on March 11, 2007 instead of the first Sunday of April to maximize useful daylight and save energy. Many people did not realize that a second energy saving measure was included by George W. Bush in the Energy Policy Act. Hoping that the brighter the evening the less energy people will use George has moved up the start of the full moon and pushed back the end of the full moon. The result is that the full moon is now visible for two weeks and the quarter and three quarter moon lunar cycle takes up the rest of the month. The resulting loss of the new moon should result in a significant increase in moonlight throughout the month and a terrific opportunity for more moonlight hikes.

PIONEER VALLEY HIKING CLUB RULES OF CONDUCT

Outgoing 2006 Club VP Mike-C. (Any relation to our US VP Cheney?) has established these General Rules of Conduct applicable to all hiking club members as his last outgoing Vice Presidential action. Clearly defined rules of conduct are necessary for the orderly operation of every club. The PVHC requires that each hiker faithfully abide by these rules and regulations.

- 1. Hikers shall maintain a presentable appearance at all times and shall wear clothing appropriate to their Hike. Remember "Cotton Kills"! Only synthetic cloths (we recommend Halliburton/Chaney textiles made from genuine Iraq oil)
- 2. Reporting to hikes under the influence of unauthorized substances or the introduction, possession or use of unapproved tobacco, coffee, chocolate, or ice cream on Club functions is prohibited. Only "PVHC" brand products such as PVHC GORP, PVHC dehydrated Ice Cream, and PVHC Hikers' Java, (available for purchase at the club concession stands* and Dave's Deals) is allowed. *Concession stands owned and operated by Halliburton/Cheney Enterprises.
- 3. Shopping, photography, resting at scenic vistas, and other inappropriate conduct is prohibited on Club events and will not be tolerated. Professional photographs of your hike will be available for a nominal fee taken with our first rate "Eyein-the-sky" surveillance drones at the Halliburton Ice Cream concession stand at the end of the hike. Any unauthorized photographs taken on hikes will remain the property of the club's president.
- 4. Hikers must avoid tardiness, absence, and departing early from hikes without the permission of the club president. The president is explicitly exempt from the tardiness policy.
- 5. Every hiker has a duty to protect and safeguard the VP's lumbering operations on National park lands and drilling operations in the artic tundra.

Violation of any of these regulations may result in disciplinary action ranging from warning to discharge from the club. The Club Feetprints editor reserves the right to make inspections of club members backpacks, lunch boxes, and vehicles and other items of personal property for excess food and snack materials. "I am working on a research paper. My topic is: How Do Glaciers Move? Can you please tell me what you know about the movement of glaciers?"

"Glaciers feel best when they have one movement per day. Some glaciers do just fine with fewer movements, but when they don't have movements for a long time the result can be quite bad. Glaciers that move much more frequently tend to have loose and soft terminal moraines (also called rock piles). Glacial movement is almost always associated with the release of water. But sometimes glaciers release water without experiencing a movement."
